



FEEDING THOSE IN NEED

For those who are in need of a meal, the Community Food Kitchen (CFK) is open every Monday and Thursday from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. For the past 18 months, CFK has been open and serving the hungry. CFK served 22 people opening day, August 6, 2012, and is now serving 60 to 80 people each Monday and Thursday. We served 5,445 people in 2013. Our basic income is from individuals, businesses, church and civic groups. CFK has been blessed by the generosity of this community and the surrounding areas. CFK was awarded a \$10,000 grant for food from the Wythe-Bland Foundation with the stipulation that CFK must match this amount in order to qualify to receive it. CFK is continuously seeking volunteers to assist in this ministry. 
