Babbs Thomas's husband, William, died in 2004 after being in pastoral ministry for 57 years. She



In 1962, he began a hobby of creating plaster molds of hands which he later cast in bronze. At first, he focused on surgeons' hands just to show the diversity of physical fea-Flatt's work expanded to include famous people like Walt Disney, Louis Armstrong, Dr. Seuss, Winston Churchill and Dwight Eisenhower.

Baylor University Medical Center in Dallas is known as one of the top medical facilities in the country with top-shelf surgeons, state of the art equipment, and quality care from staff. The lobby of BUMC's Truett Hospital building features a display of over 100 bronzed hands.

Seeing this exhibit not only evokes memories of well-known persons but also causes you to think about the incredible gift of your own hands. We cradle children and grandchildren with our hands but also use them to protect ourselves from danger. We can heal or hurt, build up or tear down.


**COMING-JULY 24-26**


